**MINUTES OF OUR LADY QUEEN OF ANGELS CATHOLIC CHURCH PARISH
COUNCIL MEETING ON JANUARY 24, 2017 CONTINUED**

E. Spirituality and Social Justice-Keith Hebert – continued

On November 2016, the annual blanket drive collected and distributed donations of 42 blankets, 4 electric blankets, 42 sheets, 9 sleeping bags, 13 pillows, 4 electric heaters and other miscellaneous items which were brought to the barn at Evangeline Downs. Donations from the Men's Group provided for the annual Thanksgiving Day racetrack workers meal at Evangeline Downs. More than 110 workers were well fed and led in prayer service by Chaplain Dwight Brown. His assistants and family send prayers and thanks to all making this possible. These efforts are a joint outreach of Our Lady Queen of Angels Church and the Evangeline Christian Outreach Ministry. The vast majority of these workers are Catholic.

Fr. Mesley conducted an Advent Mission at Queen of Angels 12/04-05. He offered words of encouragement and suggestions as to how we can deepen our spirituality. Fr. Kevin MacDonald will conduct the 2017 Advent Mission.

Over 5,000 "Pray Opelousas" bumper stickers have been distributed with 2,500 on order.

Information is being sought from ULL regarding a program for high school seniors addressing pornography issues.

Deacon Jerome Collins reports that the Adoration Chapel is running smoothly.

Paula Carriere announced she has given high school seniors college contacts for continuing their Catholic practice after graduation.

G. Organizations-Charlie Dore

The Knights of Columbus Tootsie Roll Drive raised \$2,598. Checks were written to ARC of St. Landry and to St. Mary's Residential Training Center. Msgr. DeRouen reported the Church bells installed in Church steeple cost \$4,300.

The Grand Knight announced that 500 copies of "Confessions of a Mega Church Pastor" have been purchased by the K of C for distribution to parishioners on Epiphany Sunday.

Other reports were as follows: Ron Marcantel will cook for the January and February meetings. Msgr. DeRouen will cook for the April meeting.

The Right to Life-March was well attended and successful. The local Tony Chachere Headquarters provided a delicious Jambalaya, drinks and snacks for lunch, for the group.

Youth Group(Scott)-The group assisted in a successful food drive and participated in the Walk for Life. Plans were made to play bingo with nursing home residents.

Youth Group(Ann)-The group assisted nursing home residents to shop for family and friends. The group enjoyed pizza and a movie night together, attended the Pro-Life march, are planning a field trip to Baton Rouge to visit the Cathedral, a Greek Orthodox Church, and also to visit LSU, a large flea market and several museums.

Couples Group-continues to work with weekly Children's Liturgy and have started making preparations for the annual Family Fun Day on Palm Sunday.

Altar Society-The group helped with decorations and cleaning the Church during the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. They also hosted a successful Twelve Night party.

Joe Hidalgo said he and Gordon have not done anything on the parking lot exit improvements due to inclement weather. In the spring they will power wash, repaint stipes and make signs subject to approval by the Board. Msgr. DeRouen suggests a bulletin insert with diagrams explaining proper use of the entrance/exit. Keith Hebert suggests widen entrances, and "x" out first parking space on each side, and also, to fix the curb for easier entrance. Also addressed was a need for reflecting sign, speed bump and/or reflectors on the curb at the corner(s) of the Church to slow people down. Mr. Gaudin suggests plastic speed bumps as they allow for drainage.

In a discussion involving Church etiquette Msgr. DeRouen is thinking about a presentation at Mass in the Fall.
